The FULLWELL Safer Neighbourhood team is aiming to improve the quality of life of people who live and work within Fullwell Ward. We are striving to make the ward a safer place and cut residential burglary.

You can help to reduce the risk by using locks that you already have, securing doors further by fitting stronger locks and being MORE vigilant. Also it is a good idea to fit a letterbox cage to prevent persons from reaching through. This is backed up by making sure all windows and doors are locked and secured whilst out of the house and during the night. Please also lock away or secure all garden tools so as to ensure YOU are not a victim of crime.

Most burglaries are carried out by opportunists. In around 20% of all burglaries, they don't even have to use force; they enter through an unlocked door or window



FULLWELL CRIME FOR MARCH 2010

There have been a total of 96 allegations of crime made to police with regard to incidents occurring within Fullwell Ward.

There have been 8 Residential Burglaries, 3 Attempted Burglaries, and 1 Non Residential Burglary.

There were 7 people caught by police in possession of Drugs.

There were 4 motor-vehicles stolen.

There were also 9 vehicles broken into and property stolen - Sat Nav's and other items left on display.

ARRESTS AND MORE

During the month of March Fullwell SNT Police Officers have arrested SIX (6) individuals for offences of Burglary, Theft, Traffic matters, Breach of Curfew and Harassment offences.

We have also Dealt with a further Five (5) persons who were caught in possession of Cannabis. These matters were dealt with by way of Formal Warnings and £80.00 Fixed Penalty Tickets.

Police also issued a Fixed Penalty Notice for Driving whilst NOT wearing a seat belt. SNT Police Officers are also carrying out daily random road checks, primarily to combat burglary, however if driving offences come to light then they are being dealt with appropriately with a Ticket

For Example - No Seat Belt or Driving whilst holding a mobile Phone = £60.00
