Public Set Priorities

We listen to the concerns of the community and our priorities are set by local people who sit on a neighbourhood panel (19/10/2010).

You said the following priorities were important to you:

- Burglary (Ward Wide)
- Vehicle Crime (Ward Wide)
- Crime and ASB (High Street Barkingside)

Burglary.

During the month of November we have continued to conduct High visibility and plain clothes patrols, to disrupt, deter and detect those responsible for burglary. 1 arrest has been made for burglary. In recent burglaries access to the premises is predominantly forcing UPVC rear kitchen or Patio doors. Small items stolen, jewellery, lap top computers, NEW property intended for Christmas gifts etc. New or expensive cars parked on driveways outside houses are also being targeted, the houses broken into for the keys. The majority of these burglaries occurred during the day whilst the occupiers were out. Please keep an eye out for any suspicious behaviour and report it at the time.

Theft of / Theft from Motor Vehicle.

During November we have conducted patrols in areas where vehicle crime has been prevalent. We have arrested two males for theft of a motor vehicle and criminal damage to another motor vehicle. Several incidents were associated with Halloween and Fireworks night and more recently the Snowball throwing period. Number plates and unattended property (on view) are being stolen. Vehicles are also stolen whilst drivers leave keys (engines running) in ignition and car unlocked. PLEASE LOCK YOUR CAR – DO NOT LEAVE IT UNATTENDED WHILST DE-FROSTING IT.

High Street

Fullwell SN officers are policing the ward in both Uniform and Plain clothes. These proactive patrols will continue throughout the Christmas period.

Arrests and Other Matters

During the month of



November Fullwell SN police officers have arrested **6** people for Theft, Theft of M/V, Handling Stolen Goods, Burglary, Fraud, Shoplifting and production of Cannabis.

Fullwell SN Police officers have conducted **2** Drug search warrants at **2** separate addresses within the ward and as a result arrested **2** individuals who were cultivating Cannabis.

We have also issued 6 people with Cannabis warnings and have issued 30 traffic tickets (£60.00 and 3 points) for driving whilst using a hand held mobile phone.

1 further Fixed Penalty ticket was issued to a shoplifter who stole property to the value of £7.79 = (£80.00 Fine). Over **240** people were stopped and or searched within the Ward of Fullwell by officers from Fullwell SN Team. The above sends out a clear message that crime and anti-social behaviour within the ward will NOT be tolerated and any evidence of such will be acted upon in order to improve your quality of life.

On another note we have a NEW member of the team PCSO 7526JI Ahmed has replaced PCSO 7758JI Diggins who is now policing Hainault Ward.
